The second half of exground filmfest also has a lot going for: red-hot the documentary THE GREEN PRINCE on Saturday, November 22 at 5.30 pm in Caligari FilmBühne in the section International. Also on Saturday this year's panel on the country in focus program will take place in the foyer of Murnau-Filmtheaters at 4 pm. The filmmakers present will discuss terms of production and possible financing in Mexico. Current issues such as widespread corruption and the war between drug mafia and security forces shall also be topics.

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
